Characterization of Composite Score Increase Outcomes:

(Total Score Increase = Strategy Increase + Practice Effect Increase)

- -?, or +0 is always the result of students not making up missed classes and/or not completing practice question assignments
- +1 is a disappointing increase (unless the student only needed 1 point!)
- +2 is a Good Increase
- +3 is a Very Good Increase!
- +4 is a Great Increase! Fantastic!
- +5 or more is a SUPER INCREASE!!

Although many of our students have achieved a 5, 6, 7, even an 8 point increase, most of our students who have improved that much from their 'original before course score' have done additional practicing and taken the exam a second time after completing the course. For this reason, it is advised that a student coordinate their test-taking and college application schedules so that it is possible to take the ACT at least twice after the course within application deadlines.
