A.C.T. Superscoring – Coming to your chosen college or university?

Students can strengthen their ACT score by improving individual section scores.

To support the growing trend of students taking the ACT Test multiple times, the ACT now provides an automatically calculated ACT Superscore to all students who have taken the ACT Test more than once from September 2016 to current day. Score reporting will now include the option for students to send their best ACT Test results to colleges and include a calculated ACT Superscore. Superscoring allows students to submit their highest scores for college admission and scholarship purposes. The Superscore is a recalculation which shows the highest possible composite score across multiple ACT Tests. It reflects the average of the four best subject scores (best English, best Math, best Reading, best Science) from each of the student's ACT Test attempts. *It is up to individual colleges and universities to decide whether to consider a Superscore*.

A.C.T. Individual Section Retesting – Not yet, if ever.

Students can concentrate their efforts.

The previously announced ACT Individual Section Retesting would make it possible for students to focus study efforts on individual subjects that are part of the ACT Test (English, Math, Reading, Science) without having to study for the entire test again. ACT Individual Section Retesting would be available to all students who have taken the full ACT Test. After extensive consideration, ACT *WILL NOT BE* rolling out individual section retesting in the 2021–2022 school year and may never do so, opting instead to provide students with as many opportunities as possible to take the full ACT Test.
